Lawyer John DeMuth has filed a motion in Paulding County Probate Court to allow the body of Nancy Eagleson to be disinterred from the local cemetery where she was

buried nearly sixty-two years ago. A hearing is set for September 20th, in front of Judge Michael Wehrkamp.

Fourteen-year-old Nancy Eagleson and her five-year-old sister, Sheryl, were walking home from a movie in downtown Paulding, Ohio, around seven p.m. on Novem-

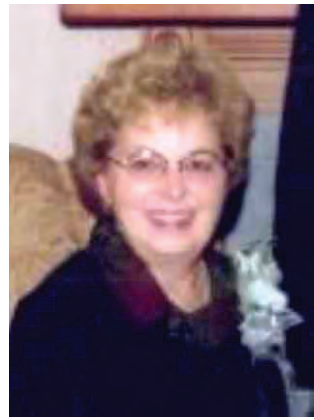

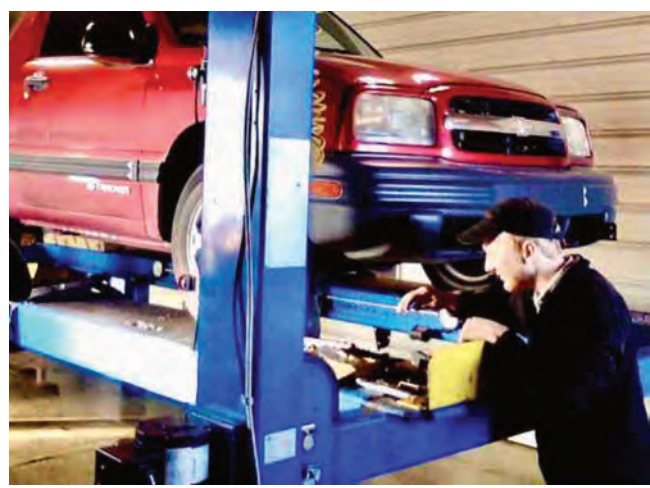

Hand & Mouth

I have a twenty-year old Chevy that looks like a baby Jeep-like vehicle that some call a "Barbie Jeep". It is truly the runt of the family of American off-road vehicles. I had some underbody rust protection work done on this vehicle by Rufus whose shop is on Antwerp Road in Grabill, Indiana. We talked over the work to be done, pricing, etc., and with a shake of the hand and by word of mouth, Rufus did a great job as we agreed.

Living overseas has taught me that business happens in a different way there than in small-town Indiana often times. For an apartment I had bought all the furniture we needed directly from the factory that made it in order to save money. It was not assembled, sanded, nor stained. I knew I could handle that job myself. I had completed different pieces of

furniture when I realized I just didn't have the space anymore to complete the table and hutch. I found a local business to sand and paint those last pieces who offered me a fair market price, but not cheap. I agreed and hired a truck to move the furniture to the business and met the owner that was to sand and paint them. After I said "hello" to the owner and mentioned the work and the price we agreed upon, he replied, "the price is now 25% more as we didn't make the previous agreement in writing." Knowing I would be in between a rock and a hard place, he had waited to inform me after the moving truck pulled away. He knew I would lose money to hire the truck back to pick up the unfinished furniture and leave if I didn't agree to his new price. I had no negotiating leverage (nor ability in the new language and culture), so reluctantly I went ahead with the overpriced work.

I still have a bitter taste in my mouth about how that furniture owner did business and took advantage of me. I have learned to be a little bit more wary when doing business transactions, and a lot more thankful for the people I can do transactions with by just a handshake and spoken word.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

ATHLETIC CALENDAR

Our staff looks forward to welcoming back all students and their families for the start of another school year with Open House Tuesday, August 23rd from 5:00 – 6:30 p.m. Our first day of classes for Gr. 1 – 12 will be Wednesday, August 24th. Kindergarten students will have their first day of classes Monday, August 29th and Pre-School will start Wednesday, August 31st.

In order to effectively carry out a successful school year with respect to health and wellness, we need parents to assist us with educating your child on the importance of maintaining safety routines and exhibiting healthy behaviors. School personnel will likewise continually emphasize and reinforce student responsibility for safe and healthy behaviors that protect them and those around them. School personnel will also clean, disinfect, and sanitize our school facility, playgrounds, and busses on a routine basis.

On the academic front, our staff will continue to receive professional development opportunities during this school year in order to increase their abilities and improve their skill set to provide instruction and engage student acquisition with respect to the state academic content standards. The district will also continue to provide training for staff with respect to an inclusionary/co-teaching model of instruction. We are also pleased to share with you that for the first time in several years, we will have a certified foreign language teacher instructing our students via a Live Stream service provided by Elevate K-12.

Throughout the summer months, we have finalized construction of the state-of-the-art Innovation and Aquaponics Center. We are excited to inform you that we will have our grand opening ribbon cutting ceremony Tuesday, August 23rd at 4:30 p.m. prior to our annual open house event. Additional improvements to the school building and property have included the installation of new carpet in the B-Wing hallway and three classrooms. We have also completed repairs to our parking lots and drives along with sealing and painting of markings on the surface. A new sidewalk has also been put in place that will allow individuals to walk from the west side of the school building to the parking lot located at the softball/baseball field complex.

In regards to the softball/baseball field complex, plans are in the works to build a community wellness center at the south end of the stone parking lot next to the softball and baseball fields. When completed, the facility (referred to as "The Range") will feature a large recreational space, multi-purpose classroom, restrooms, concession/kitchen and patio area, and elevated press box. The project will be partially funded with federal funds received through ARP/ESSER relief funds.

Parents are reminded that we will once again utilize the number tag system for elementary student pick-up in the large circle drive at dismissal time. If you are unfamiliar with this system and need a number tag or forgot your family number, please call the District Office at extension 2300 or Elementary Office at extension 2200 or stop by the District Office entrance during Open House and staff will be available to assist you.

Community members are encouraged to frequently visit our school website and view happenings taking place at our school or better yet, download our new school app by going to the App or Play Store, search "Antwerp Schools" and install the free Antwerp Local Schools App. The app has numerous features that will keep you updated on news, events, school delay and clos-

ings, and more. You may choose what notifications and alerts you want to receive through the MY ALERTS tile. Additionally, parents are reminded that the ONEVIEW parent portal is located in the PARENT tab and QUICK LINKS tab in the upper right-hand corner of the website. Parents should utilize the ONEVIEW parent portal to update student information such as change in address and/or contact numbers. The ONEVIEW Portal also serves as a location for parents to complete student forms (Emergency Medical Form, Transportation Form). The ONEVIEW parent portal is also the location parents may visit to complete the registration process for new students to our district.

We have several new employees who will work with our students during the coming school year. Mrs. Lyndsey Miller will serve as an Intervention Specialist and work with our special needs students at the elementary school level. Mrs. Ashley Fidler will serve as an Intervention Specialist and work with our special needs students at the middle school level. Mrs. Fidler is replacing Mrs. Runk who accepted a similar position with the Northwest Ohio Educational Service Center. Mrs. Katrina Tonneas has been hired by the Western Buckeye Educational Service Center to assist with intervention services for our students in PK-Grade 5. Mr. Dustin Greenwood will serve as a full-time bus driver. Mr. Greenwood is replacing Paul Adams who retired at the end of the prior school year. Mr. Dave Parrish will serve as a full-time bus driver. Mr. Parrish will complete several routes assisting students with transportation to and from our school building and other educational centers. We are also in the process of selecting an aide who will be hired by the Western Buckeye Educational Service Center to serve our elementary students. The aide will replace Mrs. Balsler who accepted a position in another district. Lastly, we are excited to announce the hiring of Mr. Joe Grimes for a vacancy we have in our cafeteria staff.

We have a couple of employees who will serve in a different capacity this year in comparison to the previous school year. Mr. Kyle Zartman has moved from his Spanish Teacher position and has assumed the Director position for the Innovation and Aquaponics Center. Mrs. Mary Lillemo has moved from a 2nd Grade teaching position into a 1st Grade teaching position. Mrs. Lillemo is replacing Mrs. George who resigned from her position earlier this summer.

As the new school year begins, please remember that the most meaningful factor in assisting students to have a successful school experience is our ongoing partnerships with parents and guardians. In order to help your children attain their goals, we need your involvement, whether through attending conferences, extra-curricular events, volunteering in your child's school, or, perhaps most importantly, reinforcing the importance of education and on-time school attendance.

Through the range of experiences and emotions throughout a year, from celebrations to heartbreak, we should always remember that we are all stronger – and our students' experience better – when we work together as a team, extended family and community.

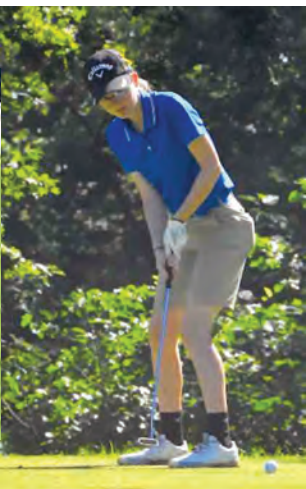
LUNCH PROGRAM

For the last 2+ years, American school children, regardless of family financial circumstances, enjoyed free school breakfast and lunches via a program to expand the benefit to all children during the COVID-19 pandemic. That program has ended as we get ready to start this school year. Parents must complete a Free/Reduced priced Breakfast/Lunch Application form in order for school officials to verify your household income status for qualification of either a free or reduced price for breakfast and/or lunch during the 2022-2023 school year. Applications will be placed in elementary student packets and may be picked up at Open House August 23rd or they will be sent home with elementary students their first day of school. MS/HS students will have an application attached to their class schedules.

Note that students who qualify for free breakfast/lunch may also qualify for waivers of workbook fees or P-EBT cards. Letters are being sent to families who are pre-qualified for the program. It is NOT necessary for Pre-Qualified families to complete the Free/Reduced Application. If you did not receive a letter and want your child to participate, please fill out and return the application form the first week of school.

Lunch prices for students this year will remain the same at \$2.80 for K-5, \$2.90 for 6-12, and \$1.50 for breakfast (all grades). Adult lunch is \$4.00. Extra milk is 50 cents.

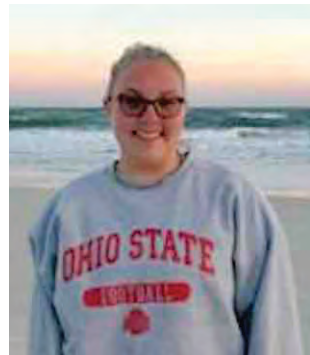

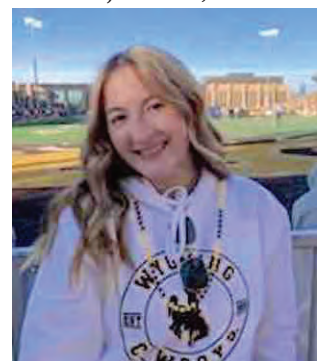

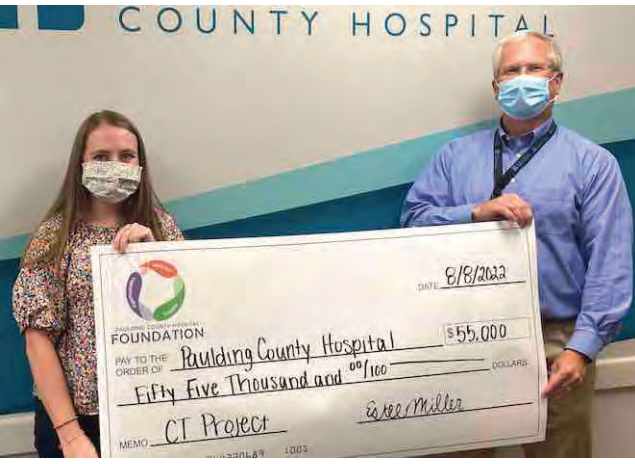

F) In the case that the ten required signatures from members of the Society from the area for which the board position represents, cannot be obtained due to circumstances such as a pandemic or other like causes, then the required number of signatures is changed to twenty of the membership as a whole. The requirement to limit it to the area being represented is waived for that election cycle only.

Any candidate not fulfilling the above-listed requirements shall be ineligible for election as director. Items B and C, above, will become effective for candidates seeking election for the 2022 election and each election thereafter.
